COUNCIL PROJECTS

LOCALS LIKE GREENACRE LITTER FREE



Greenacre is one of the most vibrant places in our City, and now its community is coming together to help keep it litter-free.

A number of Greenacre business and community leaders have signed up to become champions of Council's new education campaign, 'Locals Like Greenacre Litter Free'. The campaign is aimed at attacking Greenacre's litter problem and uniting the community to take pride in their suburb. Some of the changes that are being introduced include:

- Installation of 12 new bins in Waterloo Road featuring posters of the local champions;
- Dedicated cleaning staff who pick-up litter up to 3 times a day; and
- Continuation of regular street cleaning with Waterloo Road swept twice a day.

Over the past 12 months, Council Officers spent more time cleaning up Greenacre than any other suburb in the City. The most littered items were cigarette butts (33%), paper wrappers/serviettes (24%) and drink containers (11%).

GREENACRE TOWN CENTRE UPGRADES

Work is underway on a \$607,400 upgrade of Greenacre Town Centre, expected to be completed in September. The improvements will take place along Waterloo Road, from Macquarie Street to the Citizens' Centre car park and include:

- Replacement of the existing kerb and gutter;
- · Construction of a new footpath;
- Construction of a rain garden and garden beds; and
- Installation of street furniture.

This project follows the recent completion of similar work at Panania (Stage 2, \$1.64 million), Chester Hill (\$2 million), Mount Lewis (\$240,000) and Padstow (\$260,000).

\$22 MILLION INVESTED IN FOOTPATHS & ROADS

Council is improving pedestrian access and safety by investing \$3 million in the construction of 71 new footpaths.

A further \$19 million is also being invested in 92 road projects.

NEW COMMUNITY CENTRE COMING TO YAGOONA

Local community groups and residents in the City's north-west will soon be able to enjoy the benefits of a new multi-purpose community centre. The \$2 million facility is expected to transform the Yagoona Town Centre precinct and will consist of:

- A large function room with a maximum capacity of 120 people;
- Two community meeting rooms that can accommodate up to 40 people each;
- · Kitchen facilities:
- Foyer and gallery space;
- Office space for Sydney South Area Health Service (SSAHS); and
- Car parking spaces, including disabled parking, and a designated mini-bus drop-off area.

Work is expected to start later this year and be completed mid next year.

The new playground is a joint project between Council and the Touched By Olivia Foundation which aims to provide a fun place for children with a disability to enjoy. Construction is already well underway, with accessible toilet facilities recently completed.

FOCUS ON STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES

Residents will be the big winners with Council set to invest \$10 million in community-focused projects under the NSW Government's Stronger Communities Fund (SCF) programs.

\$10 million has been allocated to the City of Canterbury Bankstown under the SCF. That sum must be allocated through two programs, being:

- Community Grants Program An allocation of up to \$1 million in Grants for individual projects up to \$50,000. targeted at incorporated not-for-profit community groups for projects that build more vibrant, sustainable and inclusive local communities: and
- Major Projects Program \$9 million allocated to large scale priority infrastructure and services projects that deliver longterm economic and social benefits to communities.


LOCAL SAFETY FORUM -

Did you know running a second fridge adds around \$300 to your power bill? If you have an old fridge or freezer sitting around your home, consider


